## MAKING THE MOST OF YOUR DAY...

### 1 Admissions Building and car park

The **Admissions Building** is next to the main car park, check the board inside admissions to see which trams are in service, then walk down the slope, under the bridge and into the Tramway Village.

### 2 Town End Terminus

The tram journey starts from **Town End Terminus**. Enjoy the scenic route to open countryside with views across the Derwent valley.

### 3 Wakebridge

Visit the **Lead Mining display** and find out more in the **Octagon**, take a stroll through the **Woodland Walk**, discover the **bird hide** and see who or what you can encounter on the **Sculpture Trail**. Don't miss the newly restored horse cabmen's shelter.

### 4 Derby Assembly Rooms

#### Survive & Thrive – The Electric Era

Located behind the old Derby Assembly Rooms façade, this exhibition looks at the reintroduction of modern tramway systems in cities around the UK.

Also in this building you'll find our new temporary exhibition exploring **'The Art of Trams'**. See a display of items from our collection showing how trams have inspired creativity, including artwork, memorabilia and decorative items.

### 5 George Stephenson Discovery and Learning Centre

Explore the **George Stephenson Discovery and Learning Centre**. Look out for details for school holiday craft activities held in the Learning Centre.

### 6 Workshop Viewing Gallery

Visit the **Workshop Viewing Gallery** and see for yourself the latest tram restoration projects, as well as displays of the restorations through the years.

### 7 Tram Depots

The tram depots house our heritage collection of working trams, plus others waiting their turn to be restored to full working order. Discover more from the interpretation on the rear walls of the depots.

### 8 Great Exhibition Hall

The **Great Exhibition Hall** contains the 'Century of Trams' exhibition from 1860s to 1960s.

**History Maker's Exhibition – The Creative Genius of Michael Holroyd Smith.** A permanent exhibition for all the family, exploring the life and work of 'History Maker' Michael Holroyd Smith, with hands on exhibits, digital interactives and previously unseen items from the archive.

### 9 Indoor Play Area

**Indoor soft play area** suitable for children under 10 years. Dogs are not permitted in this area.

### 10 Outdoor Play Area

**Outdoor Play Area** - a range of activities for children plus a few picnic tables. Suitable for children aged 2-14 years.

### 11 The Stokoe Lead Smelter

With support from DerwentWISE, The Industrial Archaeological Association, Peak District Mining Museum and Enthoven Ltd., an important part of the Museum's history can be viewed via a walkway leading to a viewing platform overlooking the 18th century Lead Condenser.

### 12 Woodland Walk and Sculpture Trail

A series of sculptures feature along the enchanting **Woodland Walk**, which includes **Derwent View**, providing breathtaking views across the Derwent Valley. Borrow one of our free backpacks, choose your challenges and become a woodland explorer. Ask our Admission Team for details.

### 13 Conversations and Memories

This series of sculptures tell the stories of tramway workers and their families affected by the First World War. Pick up a 'Discovery Trail' at **Admissions** to read about their stories.
